Since 1973, 1015 JOCVs have arrived in Bangladesh. At present, there are as many as 46 volunteers are engaged in various activities throughout Bangladesh and all of them can speak Bengali language.

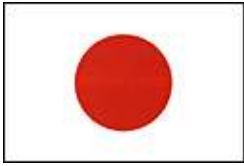
