
Musical Performances by Japanese Musicians: *"Min'yo*-Echoes of Japanese Folk Song"

A Japanese folk team, consisting of six musicians, will perform folk songs of Japan on December 8 & 9, 2009 at the National Theatre Hall of Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy. With the support from Japan Foundation, Embassy of Japan in Dhaka and Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy will jointly organize this 2-day event.
