Japan Supports Training Center of Cox's Bazar Hospital for Women and Children

By the funding of **Grant Assistance for Grass-roots Human Security Projects** (**GGHSP**), Training Center of Cox's Bazar Hospital for Women and Children was inaugurated by H.E. Mr. Shiro Sadoshima, Ambassador of Japan to Bangladesh, in South Mithachori, Chainda, Ramu on 9th April 2012.

Hope Foundation received the grant amounting to Tk 68 lakh (USD 95,085) for 'The Project for Construction of Training Center of Cox's Bazar Hospital for Women and Children', in which Hope Foundation will provide training on primary health care, water and sanitation, midwifery, new born care, family planning and village nurse training program. Hope foundation has been actively providing health care services to the disadvantaged people. The objective of this project is capacity building through training and education of local people and placing special emphasis on women and children's health care.

365 people will receive training annually from this training center which will play a great role to increase health care awareness for the issues such as safe delivery, maternal mortality rate, infant mortality rate, diarrheal diseases etc.

While expressing his heartfelt congratulations to Hope Foundation, Mr. Shiro Sadoshima hoped that this project would greatly contribute to the betterment of the health care service for the poor people in rural areas of Cox's Bazar and therefore this will help to improve the overall health care service in Bangladesh.
