Japan- SAARC High School Student delegation met Ambassador SADOSHIMA prior to visit Japan.

On November 17, 2011, a ten- member High School delegation (nine students and one teacher), who are selected for a ten-day long visit to Japan, along with other SAARC member states under the "Japan-SAARC High School Student Forum 2011" program, organized by "Japan-SAARC High School Students Forum Executive Committee" visited the Embassy of Japan with an aim of a courtesy call to the Ambassador of Japan to Bangladesh, H.E. Shiro SADOSHIMA.

This year's exchange program scheduled from Nov.23-Dec.2, 2011,where some 80 participants from the SAARC countries along with Japanese high School students will have the opportunity to learn, discuss and make presentation on the measures and action to safely ensure the hygienic supply of water, visiting landfill site /waste disposal site of Tokyo in order to learn on a better waste management system, wind power and solar energy generation, visiting High Schools for observing Japanese class management, extracurricular activities and engage in discussion. In addition, the program will endeavor to further enhance understanding of Japan through visits to historical and important places in Kyoto and Hiroshima in order to learn about Japanese history and culture, as well as to understand the efforts and strong wish for peace in Japan and provide an opportunity to think about the issues of disarmament, nonproliferation, and peace respectively. Besides, through home stays and high school visit events, that will facilitate to understand the Japanese life style.

Ambassador SADOSHIMA welcomed the student delegation and hoped that the young Bangladeshi participants will utilize properly this opportunity of visiting Japan. The Ambassador also hoped, the valuable experiences the young students will gain through this visit will help enormously to build up their future careers, strengthen their leadership skills and to enhancing the stronger bilateral relations between Japan and Bangladesh as well.
